

**Montgomery Borough Council**  
**June 9, 2026**

**\*\*Meeting was conducted publicly at Borough Hall**

President Sanguedolce called the meeting to order at 6:30pm.

- I. All recited the Pledge of Allegiance
- II. Roll call was taken Steve Cook-P, Donald Gordner-P, Sean Jamison-A, Ruth Little-P; Margaret Mathis-P, Craig Miller-P; and Rocky Sanguedolce-P . Also, present were Borough Coordinator Donna Miller; and Solicitor Jonathan Dewald.

- III. Fire Department Report. Brad Feaster reviewed the report; nothing more to report
- IV. EMA Report. Greg Gruver reviewed the written report. EMA will be having a food stand at the Dranktuary on Saturday, June 13<sup>th</sup>; they will be helping with communications at the Lycoming County Fair July 9-18<sup>th</sup>; Donald Gordner asked what EMA would be doing at the HNT event at Penn College; Greg stated training on hostage and SWAT negotiations. Margaret Mathis stated they could use the parking spots in back of the Library at any time.
- V. Public Concerns. Tim Jutsum from E Houston Ave asked about paving of alleys; he gave pictures; and asked about street sweeping and stated there are two spots from utility repair that need to be addressed; Donna Miller replied as the one on N Main Street was fixed last week from UGI; the one on Montgomery Street will be repaired during the repaving project.

- VII. Approve April 2026 Treasurer's Report. A motion was made by Steve Cook to approve; second Craig Miller. Motion carried.

- VIII. Code Enforcement Officer's Report. Jeff Frey reviewed the written report; Ruth Little asked about permit tracking and the rental ordinance; Jeff stated this is starting tomorrow; Ruth Little gave Jeff Frey complaints from resident(s); Margaret Mathis stated all complaints go through the Borough office and must be signed; these complaints will not be addressed unless filed through the Borough office.
- IX. Solicitor's Report. Solicitor DeWald reviewed the Ordinance 2026-2 that will be voted on under New Business. Nothing can be done until it is adopted; this is just

for the streets listed on this Ordinance.

- X. Mayor's Report. Mayor Bennett was not in attendance.
- XI. Borough Coordinator's Report. Donna Miller reported the following:
  - The Community Clean Up week was May 26-30, 2026 at Clinton Twp; no invoice as of yet; but 21 loads was taken to the landfill; last year 14 loads; 79 Montgomery residents used this.
  - No new Firework donation to report.
  - Montgomery Street project has started this week; detour Brouse Road for day only; WBRA and Borough has started repairs; Hawbaker's will start soft cutting next week; Bridge project to start August 3<sup>rd</sup>; closing the bridge
  - No Montgomery Water Authority meeting on June 18, 2026; next meeting will be held July 16<sup>th</sup>. Phase I of Broad/Wagner is moving along; contractors should be in next week for soft digging.
  - the vacant land at 84 N Main Street was sold at a Tax Repository Sale
- XII. Committee Report.
  - Public Works: Streets, Sidewalks, Parking Lots, Water Authority etc.- None
  - Parks/Recreation/Holiday/Event. Margaret Mathis stated a meeting was held May 25<sup>th</sup>; lots of new ideas talked about; keep updated on the Facebook page; Event committee and the Library will split cost for purchasing a movie license to have movies at Park; possibly having a "Second Saturday" event in Heritage Park. Library started the summer reading program with an "Unearth a Story" program on Saturday, June 6<sup>th</sup> at Heritage park; changes are being done at the Library, everyone is welcome to stop; Saturday, June 13<sup>th</sup> at 11am in Muncy Lions Park there will be a "Find a Fossil" program; Wednesday June 17<sup>th</sup> @ 2 pm; there will be a dinosaur program at the Montgomery Park; open to the first 60 kids; Saturday July 25<sup>th</sup> at Heritage Park will be the Fun with the Firefighters program; Drop in events every Monday & Friday.

Motion carried.

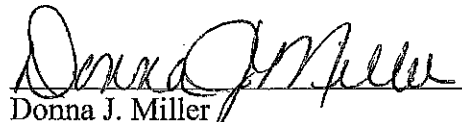
3. Police Guns. Steve Cook stated he has contacted a gun dealer, they will be in to look at the guns and other equipment in the next few weeks.
